Remembering Ron Evans

I first met Ron in September 1997 when I moved out to L'Arche Greater Vancouver from L'Arche Sudbury.

Ron and I spent many days together with our friends in the Emmaus Centre. He would often walk up from Emily House, with Bill Collins and Alfie McGuirk – and we could usually hear Ron coming long before we saw him – as he would be excitedly expressing himself and pointing out things of importance to Alfie, Bill, and whoever else he met along the way.

Ron helped to make the Emmaus day program a vibrant place with his **eagerness to participate** in anything that was going on. Ron was not a man who was going to be left out...whenever we asked who wanted to be a part of whatever was happening – he was the first to loudly declare “Ma!” and he would get up from where he was sitting and start moving to where he thought the action would be. In 1999 Ron, Bill and Arthur moved to Creation House where they were welcomed by Craig. I left the Emmaus Centre to be part of Creation House team. It was such a gift for me to be a part of this home. I'd been with “the guys” in the Emmaus Centre, and it was nice to get



to know each other in a new way. These were such life giving years for me and I ended up remaining in Creation House with this remarkably loving group of people until 2007. For these life shaping and love filled years, I am truly grateful!

This move to Creation House together also meant the gift of getting to know Ron's beautiful family – who loved and cared for Ron deeply and welcomed all of us in Creation House in to their lives with such generous warmth. As I got to know Ron's family over the years, it became more apparent to me why Ron **radiated so much love**...that he had been so blessed with such a **loving and caring family**.

Ron loved to walk and point things out. At a younger age Ron had lost his sight and then had his sight returned through corneal transplants, so with his renewed sight, he noticed everything! I wore dangly earrings because Ron liked them....he would reach out and gently touch my earrings and make them swing.

After supper, during prayer time he would let the full weight of his big soft hands down on his friends sitting beside him....only lifting his hands to point at each person around the table as **he prayed for them** – and to point heavenward as he prayed for his Mom and Dad. He would then wait patiently while we named his family members and would nod his head and say “Ba” for yes as we named each person who was in his heart....and only **after we'd named everyone he was thinking about, would he say his “Amen”**.



Ron expanded my musical horizons in a big way! He especially loved country music and gospel music and he loved to sing along while tapping his toes. We all learned the songs that Ron loved as he invited us into his enjoyable world of music. Sometimes we'd think Ron was sleeping and would look over and see his throat expanding as he was quietly singing with his eyes closed – letting the music wash over him.

Ron had an exuberant joy! He loved to laugh and to make others laugh with his outlandish collection of hats, sunglasses and Hawaiian shirts. He was a good man for a belly laugh.

As rowdy as Ron could be at times, he also had a very quiet, calming presence. I witnessed so many assistants whose hearts were transformed through their relationship with Ron. **He called others into relationships of simply being together.**

Even in these later years when life was much more difficult for Ron

and he wasn't as vibrant and active as he'd been in his younger years, he drew people to him. **Ron's life was a real presence of God's love in the world.**

After Christmas Ron moved into Palliative Care where he continued to be surrounded by the love of his family and friends. On January 3rd when we were with Ron and the signs became clearer that he was preparing to leave us, we surrounded his bed and sang to him. Scott picked up the guitar and we sang "You are My Sunshine" and then a quiet version of "Sweet Home Alabama". As we sang the closing lines of the song "Lord I'm Coming Home to You", Ron peacefully took his last breath.

I give thanks that, for his whole life, Ron knew how precious and loved he was. **His life was a gift for the world.** The world was a better place because of Richard James Ronald Evans' life and we are better people because we've been privileged to love Ron and to be loved by him.
