My first memories of Gwenda were at Community prayer where she was part our musical group, the Messengers. I marveled at how she played her drum with such focused attention, her head gently swaying, in perfect rhythm and a look of peace on her face.

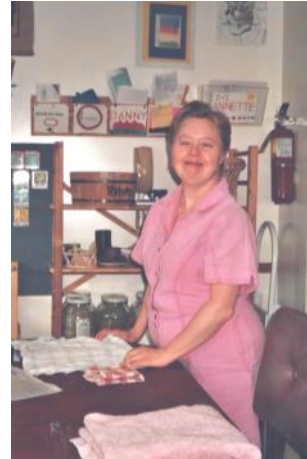
Gwenda loved to sing and knew the words to many songs. People would be chatting and she'd pick out a little snippet in the conversation and suddenly pipe up and exclaim softly "that's a song!" When you'd ask "what song?" she'd use the phrase she'd just heard and break into the song with gusto and everyone would join in.

A gift Gwenda gave to the world was the way she smiled at people. She would fix her gaze on someone, when their eyes met, her face would light up and crease into the most radiant smile I have ever seen. It could be with someone she knew very well or with a complete stranger. She would beam at them with such delight and you could see the person on the receiving end of that smile being warmed through. Often it was followed by her lifting up her arms to give and receive a big hug. I believe that gaze and those hugs were a kind of deep and tender healing for many people. I know it is true for me.

She had an amazing sensitivity and deep intuition about people and how they were doing. She seemed to know when they were sad or troubled and she'd pray for them without them necessarily ever knowing. She carried so many people in her heart.



Gwenda taught me something important. She was quite shy and often found it difficult to express herself in words. And yet she was also very determined to say what she wanted to say. She'd start a sentence and get stuck. Her brow would furrow, her shoulders would slump and she'd sigh and then she'd pluck up her courage and say to herself "try again". She would keep doing that until she got it. This was and continues to be a real source of inspiration and strength for me. I hear her coaching me when I get discouraged, I take a deep breath and say, "Okay Denise, try again!"



Gwenda was full of mischief and playfulness. I had the privilege of accompanying her on her dream trip to England to visit Judie Leckie the community's founding director. Judie welcomed Gwenda as one of our founding members in the early 1970's. On the plane we settled in for the long flight and both chose our movies. The next thing I knew my channel had changed or the volume had gone down. I wondered what was going on and looked over at Gwenda. She'd look at me with a huge grin as she fiddled with the buttons on my arm rest.

In recent years Gwenda was diagnosed with dementia. It is so painful to see someone we love slowly taken by this disease. I am sure she suffered too, both physically and mentally; yet somehow her essence remained through it all, that gentle, peaceful presence.

When I think of Gwenda, I think of the Beatitude "Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God." I believe she had a direct line to God and, by her gentle presence, her playful spirit, her love of people, her gaze of light, and those enfolding hugs she helped us to experience the mystery of the love of God.

Her favourite song was "This Little Light of Mine" and now she is a little beam of light in heaven shining on us.

From Denise's Desk

A New Mandate for L'Arche Greater Vancouver



Every four years we go through a mandate process where we consider the needs of our community and how we can more fully live our mission. Here are some of my thoughts as I accepted the challenge of leading our community through our 2017-2021 Mandate:

I love that our new mandate has the same three themes as the L'Arche international mandate. It reminds us that we are part of something much bigger as we live our mission with 149 other L'Arche communities globally. L'Arche matters, it makes a difference in our neighborhood and in our world.

I appreciate that our mandate is simple and points us very clearly in three key directions:

Go Deeper: Trust each other. In this part I hear people's concern and love for the community. People want to contribute to the community and use their gifts. They want to learn new skills and be trusted with responsibilities.

I also hear the cry for relationship and the desire to know one another better. This is the heart of the mandate and it speaks to my own heart. We commit to care for each other because we belong to each other. This inspires and gives me hope.

Go In: Make our lives better and easier. We will look at how we do things in the community, including the jobs people do and see how we can help each other to make things simpler, as well as looking for more ways for everyone to use their gifts to make our community life better.

Go Out: Try new things and welcome new people. Part of "going out" will be to move forward with the new building so everyone can easily get around and we can welcome new people into our community.

We are heading into a very important moment in our history – a time of rebirth and transformation. We are dreaming a big dream. Every single one of us has a place in this dream and we need each other. There are lots of questions and many unknowns about the road ahead. How will we get there? Who will help us? Who will we welcome? Who is knocking on our door? Who are we being called to listen to in our community, in our neighbourhood, and beyond?



A pathway is opening up before us and we must choose each step carefully. We will listen to where God is calling us, listen to our own hearts, and listen to one another. We need to remember where we come from and share our stories and memories as we go forward and leave the familiar.

Our new international leader, Stephen Posner, was asked how he relates to the new international mandate. His response encourages me as we move forward with our mandate locally:

I remember Jean Vanier saying to us one day, "Don't say that it was better before. Keep searching!" We are heirs to fifty years of history, and at the same time we must understand that the greatest tribute we can pay to our founders is to be founders in our own time."

In accepting this mandate I don't pretend to be anyone but who I am and offer you myself, with both my gifts and my limitations.

Thank you for your trust in me.
