Jean Vanier, the founder of L'Arche, turns 90 on September 10th!

Jean had no idea that welcoming two men with developmental disabilities into his home would spark a worldwide movement.

There are now nearly 150 L'Arche communities in 45 countries. Jean still lives in the village of Trosly, remaining close to his home community.

I've had the privilege of meeting Jean a number of times over the years and treasure those memories. Two memories stand out in particular. The first is when he came to celebrate our 30th anniversary in 2004 that included a public talk at St. Andrews Wesley United Church. The talk, entitled "Community: Healing the Heart, Mending the World" simply, yet profoundly, encompasses his life's mission. The church, which seats

hundreds, was packed to capacity

and yet it felt like an intimate

gathering of friends as he delivered his gentle and powerful message. He spoke of the deep and universal yearning as human beings for community and belonging.



The second was the Gospel of John retreat in Trosly. There he spoke of the "sacrament of the encounter" that Jesus had with many people He met. Jean invited us to discover the sacredness of "the other", especially with those whom we perceive to be different from ourselves. It happens when we seek to recognize, and discover, the unique gift and beauty of the person in front of us at any given moment.

I consider myself extremely fortunate to have met Jean personally. His words and presence have helped to shape my life.
