

# L'Arche Greater Vancouver 2012-2013 Annual Report

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### President of L'Arche Greater Vancouver



As Board business occupies our attention from month to month it's easy to lose track of a sense of the whole. Preparing an annual report for the community is a good opportunity to take a look at how far we've come in the past year.

Of course it's difficult to assess which of the year's events was most significant, but among the front runners was Community Living BC partially addressing ongoing operational deficits.

During the year we also received the long-awaited report from our Housing Planning Committee which was chaired by Jim Dorsey, whose term as Director has since ended. The committee's work was aided by submissions from consultants whose work was supported by a generous grant from the L'Arche Greater Vancouver Foundation. The report put forward various options for meeting our future housing needs. These ranged from modifying and upgrading our existing properties to acquiring new properties. Whichever direction we choose for the future, it will require a major fundraising effort.

In contrast to harder-edged matters like money and housing, we might turn to a warmer and softer topic—Servant Leadership. The L'Arche Canada Servant Leadership Program is continuing to develop. In the fall of 2012, both the L'Arche Greater Vancouver Society and the Foundation Boards had a presentation on the "roll-out" by Amy Demoulin from L'Arche Canada. Since then we've been aware of the program's thrust at regional and national meetings, as well as the always-with-us "Bubbles of the Month", which are resource bulletins focusing on a particular aspect of servant leadership and helps us to engage with it.

Our entire community can take great pride in the three-year Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) accreditation we received. In my last report I made reference to the high regard for L'Arche expressed by the CARF representative and this is our reward. And, of course, these things don't just happen; they are the result of a

great deal of extra effort by our assistants, administrators, and leaders.

It has also been significant to see all the work being done by Community members to generate a new Mandate which will guide us over the coming years. We look forward to seeing this work come to fruition in a final document in late spring.

In regard to specific Board matters, apart from the financial oversight our Treasurer, Ken Lee provides, we have made progress in some other governance work. We have adopted, and all Directors have signed, a new Code of Ethics and Conduct as required by CARF. And in the coming year we will be verifying the status of our risk assessment system and helping with the planning for our fortieth anniversary year.

So with a busy and demanding year behind us, I think we can look forward to a satisfying year ahead.

Because of Canada Life's matching funds, we were able to raise close to \$40,000 for our vehicle replacement program.

Our Art of Being Together signature event grew in new ways. Lots of volunteers spent countless hours making this fundraiser possible. This year we had more artists involved and new guests who came and participated. Always popular with our community and friends, both the Operations and Foundation boards together with L'Arche personnel are exploring ways to make this even bigger and better next year.

Also this year the Housing Planning Committee put forth recommendations and the community had an opportunity to contribute to the vision for our expansion plans. Looking forward, we are excited about these plans and how they will give us an opportunity to grow and make our buildings more accessible.

All these events and planning were possible because of the passion, dedication and strong faith of everyone in the community and those who support L'Arche. Your Community Leader, Denise Haskett and her team together have taken on a vision that all is possible if we have a dream - and we trust in God's power and His plan for us. Through a thorough report from housing experts and further consultations with the Community there were several recommendations developed which will help us move forward with housing plans and growth. This exciting endeavor will require more in depth exploration as well as preparation for a major capital campaign.

I continue to be grateful for the strong relationship and support from our major funder Community Living BC as we work together in partnership to support the people we serve. Led by our Regional Leader Pat Favaro, the Community entered into a process of prayer and discernment to develop a new Community mandate which will give us important direction for the next four years.

Being part of the larger family of L'Arche and a member of L'Arche Canada, we were engaged in learning about, and giving input into the development of the L'Arche Canada Servant Leadership initiative. #### **Day Programs**

Our two day programs continue to be an extension of L'Arche's mission to make known the gifts of people with developmental disabilities.



During the last year the Emmaus Day Program broadened its mission outreach by sending two members of their team to volunteer in a local school's art program. Several women in the Emmaus Day Program have started a knitting club that takes place in a local coffee shop once a week.

For a number of years the Emmaus Day Program has been faithfully baking cookies once a week and then taking them to serve people waiting at a food bank. A highlight for them this year was the purchase of a new industrial mixer that has greatly increased the ease, reliability and capacity to bake cookies and conduct their cooking classes.

The Neighbours Helping Neighbours Day Program (NHN) crew has been able to support more seniors and people with physical disabilities with lawn maintenance and other outside chores. They have more customers than ever before and have found it a challenge to keep up with the demand for their services. The NHN crew takes great pride in their work and in helping people.

In addition to their individual customers, NHN volunteered at Meals on Wheels, Collingwood Neighbourhood House, the Food Bank, Fair Haven and New Vista. They also welcomed a new volunteer who has become a valuable and dependable member of the team.

#### **Human Resources**

L'Arche Greater Vancouver continues to welcome the world and our last year was no exception. We were pleased to have Assistants join us from Japan, Hungary

and France along with several Canadians who came from other parts of the country.

A major accomplishment in 2012-2013 was successfully passing another CARF accreditation review. The surveyors acknowledged that L'Arche has a transformative effect on young Assistants and that "L'Arche Greater Vancouver employs personnel who value an intentional community of mutually transforming relationships. Personnel feel nourished by the work culture of L'Arche Greater Vancouver and express the organization as 'being well together'".

#### Other accomplishments included:

- Securing more funding giving us the ability to continue to implement the L'Arche Canada Compensation Policy.
- Offering various training sessions to Assistants that included sessions on physical and mental changes when aging, positive behaviour support, self-care/stress management, team work and the L'Arche rules of cooperation.
- People in leadership roles took part in a seminar that looked at the challenge and opportunity of change.
- Offering formation on the L'Arche Canada Servant Leadership Model and reflecting on the different aspects of servant leadership.

Volunteers continue to make a big difference in our homes, day programs and fundraising events. We are grateful for the time and energy that they so willingly give to L'Arche.




