We All Belong Event

Living Change Together and Creating Unity for the Future

People at L'Arche have lived through a great deal of change in the last two years. There was the isolation felt during the pandemic, leaving a building that contained almost 50 years of memories, settling into a temporary location while imagining what life would be like in our new building.

Our "We All Belong" event was a way for us to address these concerns that were also an important aspect of our 2021 Community Mandate. In the mandate we committed ourselves to "be resilient in times of change and challenge and renew, rebuild relationships, and ways of living community."

With these goals in mind, we set aside two days to gather, hear the findings of our COVID healing sessions facilitated by Cynthia Richardson, and reflect on the changes and challenges we experienced in the last two years. We explored our collective past by writing memories of our past and naming the joys, excitement, fears, and anxiety experienced with all these unprecedented changes.

From there, small groups gathered to explore where L'Arche is today, "The Here and Now". A community timeline was created starting from the oldest community member to the most recent.

During this exercise, people shared stories, feelings, and thoughts about being present in the community today through stories, roles, and the legacy of the community.

The final activity was to explore together the vision for community life in the new building. People wrote their dreams, concerns, and challenges on leaves that were placed on a Vision Tree.

The themes that evolved through this exercise included welcoming new people, building relationships, getting to know each other, accessibility, inclusion, continuing our traditions in a new space, and celebrations.

In reflecting about the event L'Arche's Community Leader and Executive Director Tracey Brezovski commented, "L'Arche is built on relationships and community. This meant that people in L'Arche experienced a feeling of loss when they were not able to meet in person. Our "We All Belong" day made it possible for new people to experience the community when it is gathered and, for those who have missed their friends, it felt like a family reunion."
