# We Remember Patrick Byron

Patrick William Byron was born on Sept 19, 1963 at a time when a new understanding of children with developmental disabilities was taking place in North American society. Parents began to look for options other than placing their children who were born with different abilities into institutions. Patrick's father was very clear that he would remain at home and his mother devoted herself to his care.

Patrick was in the first cohort of people with intellectual disabilities in Burnaby who experienced the integrated schooling revolution. This experience gave him solid friendships that lasted his lifetime.

Patrick grew up attending St. Francis de Sales Church where his father was an usher. Catherine, Patrick's sister, recalls coming to church and seeing Patrick as a young boy, standing next to his father and joining him in his welcoming duties. Even at this young age Pat was fully immersed in his church community. Patrick knew he belonged. These deeply rooted experiences gave Pat a unique and solid upbringing. By the time he moved into L'Arche at the age of 19, he was independently using the bus system and participating in social programs in and around Burnaby.

Pat knew he had a purpose and was curious about how he fit into the world. He was not content to just observe. He experimented with social boundaries and often crossed over the line of what was considered 'socially' appropriate. He looked for the extraordinary and wanted every day to have a bright spark in it.

Most of Pat's life took place within a six kilometer radius in Burnaby. He knew this city well and many times he was the navigator for a young assistant who was in the driver's seat.

During his 40-plus years at L'Arche Pat was a regular representative at regional and national gatherings.



He also took some special international holidays to visit former assistants in Europe who had become life-long friends.

Often assistants put down deeper roots in our community, specifically at Nazirah House and specifically because of Patrick. He cultivated a group of faithful friends to the end. His housemates bore witness to his ability to welcome and engage our hearts in a way that pulled us so deeply inward.



Pat worked at L'Arche Wood Products for many years and then he moved on to L'Arche's Neighbours Helping Neighbours. To be clear, Pat was not fond of work. He found rules confining and labour too "labourious".

But if there was anything bright or unique to be made of a day, if anything needed to be celebrated or made memorable you would find Patrick at the heart of it.

Over the years, Pat matured into a man of deep compassion, welcome, and love. It was not all lighthearted for Pat. His ability to celebrate life went much deeper. His care for his mom when she was aging and dying and his care for his neighbour, Anne Marshall, showed us all how deep he was able to go in his love. He taught us what faithfulness looked like.

The world is quieter without Pat. His exuberant entrances into a room with upset or with celebration always created the sound of life. How his life filled our ears over the years.

He was opinionated, strong-willed, and determined to the point of intense, and he was also faith-filled, soft-hearted, and forgiving to the point of heartbreaking.

As a member of his family aptly said, "I think everyone should have a Patrick in their life".

You could not help but love him. He loved you and you would love him back.

A unique aspect of L'Arche's mission is our Community Life Program. Support for people with developmental disabilities is often primarily focused on the individual's housing, financial needs, work opportunities, and social activity. At L'Arche people also have the opportunity to develop their spiritual lives.
