Life-sharing breaks down the barriers in the traditional caregiving relationship. Mutual care, respect, and compassion transform these relationships. The persons supported and those who support them help each other reach their full potential.

L'Arche does not exist for itself. We participate in and contribute to the life of our families, neighbourhood, and city, and the faith, cultural, service, and recreational organizations where we live.

L'Arche provides supports for persons with developmental disabilities to have mutual, caring relationships, a personal spiritual journey, a home, meaningful work/daytime activity, and belonging in their communities of interest.

Each person has a personal support plan developed by listening to their hopes and dreams, choices, and goals. The plan responds to their care needs as they change over time. Their circle of support helps individuals meet their goals for a full and meaningful life.

### ABOUT L'ARCHE GREATER VANCOUVER

L'Arche Greater Vancouver was founded in 1974 and the first residents to come into the community were young people from institutions that housed people with developmental disabilities. At L'Arche people with developmental disabilities are often referred to as "core people" since they are the heart of our community.

We have four homes in which 18 core people share life together with those who assist them. We welcome people of all religions, races, genders, and cultural backgrounds and support each person's spiritual journey. This simple approach to shared living between core people and assistants is a unique lifestyle, and often a transformational experience.

We also have two community inclusion programs with 19 participants. The Emmaus Day Program aims to build security and belonging through relationships by participating in meaningful, recreational, social, and volunteer outreach opportunities. Activities respect the abilities and autonomy of each individual while encouraging them to grow in their relationships with others. The second program, Neighbours Helping Neighbours, gives people with disabilities the opportunity to serve the wider community by providing yard work, simple maintenance, and chores for the elderly and others who aren't physically able to perform these tasks.

Our philosophy is that whatever their gifts or their limitations, people are all bound together in common humanity. Everyone is of unique and sacred value, and everyone has the same dignity and the same rights. The fundamental rights of each person include the rights to life, care, a home, education, and work.

Since the deepest need of a human being is to love and to be loved, each person has the right to friendship, communion, and to spiritual life.

Our Community Inclusion programs and administrative offices are located in L'Arche's temporary location on Conway Avenue in Burnaby while we await the completion of our new building in 2024.



### MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR/ COMMUNITY LEADER

As I write this, we are months from moving into our new building. After years of dreaming, planning, meetings, and fundraising, it's finally happening!

Amid this busy planning and imagining life in the new building, I want to look at all that we've experienced in the last year.

Once again, the people in our homes and programs have been our teachers. Many of them will be moving into the new building, their home and housemates will be different. Even though there is a great deal of change ahead, people have remained calm. I see people who are patient and resilient in the face of change.

I also see people in our community who are aging and have growing care needs. Some have had to be hospitalized in the last year. The house team and the rest of the community visited regularly so they would not be lonely in the hospital. Other team members made sure that everyone else in that person's home was taken care of. I see a constant stream of kindness in our community.

As we watched the building's completion, we also made sure we were ready to welcome the new people who will be joining our community. I am so grateful for everyone's patience and hard work as we developed the tools and policies we need to have in place before we move in. I am grateful that Elizabeth Law agreed to be our project manager. Because of her direction and the team's hard work, I see a well-prepared community with a plan. We are moving forward with confidence. Despite these changes, life in the community has continued. People went on retreats where they had time to reflect and build relationships with each other. We celebrated being 49 years old with special activities and remembrances. We continued to hold our Community Prayer afternoons with songs, readings, and opportunities for people to bring their concerns and thanks to God. I see a community that is faithful to its mission. With all the changes happening around us, we are still "us."

Since this is the last report I will write from my office at our temporary location, I want to repeat my thanks to everyone who has helped us in this journey. To our Board members who have provided wise counsel and encouragement. To the leadership and admin team, who often take on extra duties to make sure we have what we need going forward. To people who work in our homes and programs who continue to show compassion. To the people we serve who often serve us. To our donors who have made our vision their own. Thank you.


In conclusion, we thank all of our dedicated employees, amazing volunteers, and wonderful donors for their continued support of our L'Arche Greater Vancouver mission.


It will be a very exciting and busy few months as we prepare to move into our new building in July.
