## L'Arche Turns 50!

### Our Early Years

*The following thoughts are from a letter that Judie Leckie, our first Community Leader/Executive Director, wrote eight years after the community was founded.*

In January 1974, the United Church turned the house at 7401 Sussex over to L'Arche for one dollar per year for the first two years. They left the furniture, equipment, and even food so that literally all we had to buy was a lawnmower.

**There were only two of us in the house, and a dream was to bring together a group of men and women, some of whom would be**

**handicapped, to form a L'Arche Community.**

Kirk was one of the first people to come, although he wasn't sure that he really wanted to live with us. Iris came and struggled with the first big decision she ever had to make. Jane faced the same struggle. Arthur, who was living at Riverview, was another early friend, as were Kenneth, Richard, and Barbara, who came to several of our early coffee houses to check us out. Guy would come and have coffee with us.

We had heard of Gwenda, Eileen, Gerry, and Bill, whose parents were sick or had passed away. There was Craig, whose mum wanted him to join us. Melina came to visit and requested to live here.

### An Historic Gift

L'Arche gratefully announces that we have received a second major donation from the same family foundation. In 2019, shortly after L'Arche launched its redevelopment campaign, the **Morris and Helen Belkin Foundation** donated \$500,000 to start the campaign. This donation was the largest L'Arche had ever received. On May 1, 2024, **they added a second gift of \$500,000 for a total donation of one million dollars** towards the campaign goal of six million dollars.

**"We were struck by the passion of the people and the heart of L'Arche Greater Vancouver,"** says Margaret Corbett, representing the Morris and Helen Belkin Foundation.

"L'Arche and its supportive and productive programs allow community members to do a lot for themselves and for the community."

The redevelopment project has a projected total cost of 36 million dollars. To date, three levels of government have made provisional commitments of 13.6 million dollars. With the Morris and Helen Belkin Foundation's latest donation and long-term financing, the We All Belong campaign goal still needs \$900,000 to reach its six-million-dollar fundraising goal.

There was Gail, who was part of our community for several years but, sadly, left to go to Woodlands. Her departure left us with the wrenching awareness that not everybody would be able to live with us, that we, however much we wanted to, didn't have the capacity

**The early years were difficult but awfully good in so many ways.** We were blessed with all we needed, and though we often failed to meet each other's expectations, **there was a willingness to hope.**

A willingness to learn, a desire to love, and to die to our own selfishness. **Building community costs** – but if we are willing to pay the price, it is a healing, growing, freeing life. If there was one absolute to our sense of community, if there was only one thing to be considered, it would be that Jesus must be the center of our life. We must cast all our trust on Him, and keep our eyes on Him.

It was good to look at our community life each year. We tried to do that—to say, "Where are we going? Are we what we should be? Are we seeing God's will in all our decisions?" If we did that, and as we did that, the community became what it should be.

I must emphasize that we failed in so many ways and often lacked vision—but perhaps that must always be so. **We can only build on what has gone before.** I pray that all succeeding community members will understand that they owe a great debt, a depth of respect, and a recognition of dignity to those early members who came and remained.

# L'Arche Achieves Another Successful CARF Accreditation

We are proud to announce that L'Arche was recently re-accredited by **CARF**, the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities, for a period of three years. This latest accreditation is the sixth consecutive three-year accreditation, **the highest rating level that can be given to an organization**. Here are some of the strengths the surveyors noted in their review:

The leadership asks for a great deal of input that helps establish values, outcomes, and corporate responsibility. Every week, participants talk about what they should start, what they should stop, and what they should keep doing. Input from the core members, employees, and other stakeholders helped the organization develop its mission, vision, and values.

It is easy to see that L'Arche does not "operate in silos," as the departments work well together. This ability to work together and produce exceptional results is to the benefit of the core members. **Knowing that their input is used provides a sense of freedom and encouragement to provide even more input.**

The day programs are actively engaged in their community. Core members are supported and encouraged to actively participate in choosing and designing their daily schedules and personal goals.
