Anesia came to L'Arche Greater Vancouver in July 2017. A native of Brampton, she had heard about L'Arche from a friend who lived in one of the L'Arche communities in Ontario. She was intrigued by the idea of an intentional community of people with and without disabilities.

Anesia came to L'Arche to serve and learn more about this unique way of living. She says she is learning to be compassionate, thinking of others first and making an effort to truly connect with those around her. As one of 13 children, she grew up in a close-knit family, connecting with each other often. However, she notes that in the past her relationships with neighbours, friends and work colleagues have been less intentional in terms of connecting and spending quality time together. that, at L'Arche, everyone makes a concerted effort to show up and to check in with each other. For example, at the start of every meeting, each participant shares how they are doing. Now she finds herself building deeper connections with everyone she meets, even outside of L'Arche.

Anesia is excited about L'Arche's plans for the future that will provide an opportunity for the beauty of L'Arche to be shared with the broader community, especially with those who may not have the connections and social supports they need.

From Denise's Desk

As many of you will know, L'Arche Greater Vancouver about to realize the is dream grandest in the history of our community. We have plans for a new offer building that will housing solutions and increased program spaces for people with and without developmental disabilities.

Over the past year we have been finalizing the plan to redevelop our existing Sussex Avenue location, the building we've all known as "Shiloah". In addition to replacing three existing L'Arche homes with fully accessible homes, our plan includes the addition of 10 new units of housing for individuals who can live more independently.

Our plan also includes 29 units of affordable rental

housing that will provide options for individuals, couples and families who want to be part of an intentional community. Our new building will truly be a "place of



belonging" with expanded residential capacity and more space for community inclusion programs for adults with developmental disabilities.

An essential element of this plan is our "We All Belong" capital campaign to raise a minimum of \$5 million towards the cost of constructing the new three-story building. Ideally, our goal is to be mortgage free when we begin occupancy in the summer of 2021. This means securing as much as \$15 million in total financial support.

I look forward to sharing more details of our dream with you in the coming months.

My involvement with L'Arche spans 30 years, during which time I have held many positions: Volunteer, Live-in Assistant, Day Program Support Staff, Pastoral Presence, Retreat Leadership, Community Leader and Board Member.

My first Community was L'Arche Homefires in Wolfeville, Nova Scotia, where I became a livein assistant in September 1988 while I pursued my post-secondary studies. What started as a one-year opportunity became a four and a half year full-time vocation, extending to active involvement over three decades. Ordained to Ministry in the United Church of Canada in 1997, I have served on both the East and West Coasts. This has taken me from Homefires to L'Arche Greater Vancouver to L'Arche Saint John and back to Vancouver again.

My time in L'Arche has been significant in my formation for ministry and creating community. Many of my closest friends I met through L'Arche: my best man when I married my wife Sandra was John McNeil, one of the founding members of Homefires. Arthur Hutchinson from L'Arche Greater Vancouver prayed over me at my ordination.

Those moments, and many others, express the richness of relationship that holds us deeply. I have been blessed through L'Arche and feel immediately at home when walking into any of our communities around the world.
