### A New Home for Conrad

As Conrad's sister, I knew that we would have to work hard at finding a good place for Conrad to live. Initially, we planned for him to live in a suite in our house. This was a good plan up to a point, except that we are aging. My husband and I are older than Conrad, so the last thing we wanted to surround him with was seniors. The bigger issue was what would happen when we had to move into assisted living ourselves, or we died. We began to prepare Conrad for when we are no longer around.



We were elated when we were told he had been accepted into L'Arche's semi-independent living program. This was what he wanted, what he had dreamed of. L'Arche had been integral to his life for 34 years as he participated in their community inclusion programs. Now, he has his own place and is close to the community he has known for so long.

Conrad's suite is fully equipped with everything he needs. He has worked hard to learn the skills he needs to live independently. **Every chance he gets, he tells us how happy he is.**



He is his own person with responsibilities that he accepts with joy, knowing he is living the life he had dreamed of.

**L'Arche has created something amazing.** Encompassing group homes where individuals who need more support live within a community geared to them. A semi-independent living program where people like my brother can live with support. There are housing options for people from all walks of life who want to live in an intentional community.

**My brother is happy. He is safe.** He is part of a community that he loves. He is living an intentional life within an intentional community where he is accepted for who he is. That is a dream that we never thought would be possible.


## Meet L'Arche Greater Vancouver's "First Family"

## Words in Gratitude for the Life of Philip Beeby

October 26, 1963 – January 29, 2025

Philip lived a life that was full of love and joy. He gathered people into his orbit with his heart-warming smile and gentle, teasing nature.



He lived the past 36 years in a L’Arche home where he grew into his full potential. Philip was renowned for his “New news” announcements, and his heartfelt, inclusive (and sometimes long!) prayers for his entire family and many friends. He loved to tease; his laugh was wholehearted and infectious, and he loved unconditionally.

Denise, who would later become L’Arche’s Community leader, remembers meeting Philip in the 1980s when she and her family were weekly dinner guests at September House, Philip’s first L’Arche home. “Through the years, I repeatedly saw Philip draw young assistants out with his charming ways, often choosing the shy ones to cajole and focus his attention on. Slowly, they would become more at ease and blossom with his gentle humour and kibitzing.

“Philip lived an extraordinarily rich life with his family loving him and surrounding him every step of the way. His L’Arche family welcomed and loved him, encouraging his beautiful gifts to shine.”

His friend and house leader, Celine, recognized that Philip knew how to make people feel special. “He had nicknames for people that took time and effort to make. He acknowledged us and taught us that love is not so complicated.”
